### **Tribal Probation Academy Training Commences in Reno, NV at the National Judicial College**

The American Probation and Parole Association (APPA) is proud to announce the much-awaited Tribal Probation Academy (TPA) training taking place at the National Judicial College on the campus of the University of Nevada, Reno. This is the first week of the Tribal Probation Academy with two more weeklong trainings slated for November 12-16 and December 10–14, also at the National Judicial College.



The participants represent a myriad of tribal affiliations from across the United States fulfilling such roles as probation officers, tribal court administrators, executive directors, and chief tribal judges in their respective communities. These participants will be trained in the areas of legal matters, vicarious care, offender supervision, safety skills training, cultural considerations, program management, youth, victimization, special offender population, role of probation, and substance abuse. Faculty providing the training are well renowned in their own areas of expertise addressing these topics and have worked in partnership with APPA in providing this training with the support of the Bureau of Justice Assistance (BJA).

We are proud of APPA's continued effort and commitment to work alongside American Indian /Alaska Native governments as they work to develop their community corrections programs. The Tribal Probation Academy training reflect the goals of those communities seeking to better the lives of fellow members to make their Nations/Villages safer in the work echoed by these individuals representing the Fall 2018 Tribal Probation Academy class.
